[Copy of Warrant for Town Meeting.]

The State of New Hampshire.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bradford in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Bradford on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year. and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to divide the school money so that every scholar in town shall have an equal number of weeks schooling.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise or appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) per year for the purpose of lighting the Streets with electricity as the lights now stand.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise twenty-five dollars in addition to the twenty-five required by law to buy and repair books for the Town Library.
6. To see if the Town will vote to lease the town Hall to the highest responsible bidder.
7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD. TOWN DISTRICT.

Our schools have been well attended and most of the scholars have shown much improvement. As a rule they have been interested in their school work and this was like half the lesson already learned.

To encourage this interest which the children take in their school is the solemn duty of every parent.

Let our boys and girls be taught in the homes as well as in the school-rooms not from books alone, but taught by precept and example that character building is the all-important work of their young lives. Lessons along this line the youngest children learn, for no child can help imitating what he sees. One good father and one good mother are worth a dozen school-masters.

Below is a statistical report of our schools for the year ending, February 15, 1900.

The number of scholars in town was 148.

The number of children between the ages of 5 and 15 reported by the Truant Officers was 79 boys and 69 girls.

Report of Special School District.

The duties of a School Board are many and varied, and seldom accomplish the good they wished or hoped for, when they entered upon their duties. The work in some of its phases is delightful, but has numerous details, which at times make it very unpleasant.

The Grammar department has prospered under two efficient teachers, Miss Laura May Blood of New Boston, the spring and summer terms. She was fresh from Normal School and brought up to date ideas. One special secret of her success was tact in gaining the love and good will of her pupils. Discipline was extra, and acquired with a gentle but firm hand. We bespeak for her abundant success in her chosen vocation. It was hoped she would return for the winter term; but wishing to graduate with her class at the Normal School, she could not be retained. Again the school was fortunate in securing the services of Miss. Myra Knowlton of Weare, a Normal graduate. The term is still in session, but she is doing fine and successful work, and we highly recommend her. The primary department has through the year, been under the teaching of Miss. Lizzie Peaslee, who works hard for the school and scholars, and has taught very successfully many terms of school. We wish her continued success. A few suggestions for the benefit and success of our schools here: and the town district have been forceably brought to the notice of your committee. The success, prosperity, and high standing, of what our schools ought and should be, is almost wholly acquired by the hearty cooperation of parents and teachers, in the work of the schools.

Pupils should be taught at home, that they go to school to acquire an education, to fit them for life's work, and to conform to rules and regulations of the school, just so far as is possible. The honor roll shows who of the scholars have done the best. There should be cooperation between Com., both prudential and superintendent so as to ensure a better understanding of the duties of each committee,

and what can or ought to be done for the best welfare of the schools.

If the town and village committee could meet and confer together occasionally on the needs success and uplifting, for higher standard of all our schools, it would be a help to all interested. Each member should be fully qualified to assume the duties expected of them, in concord, and meet together often to fully understand the necessity of working for best interest of the schools, and when such committees have been chosen and elected by the people; How much better it would be if the people would cordially support and sustain them in doing the work of the school year. School rooms here and over town are not sufficiently supplied with maps charts blackboards, especially portable ones and supplementary books. Other towns of the state are far ahead of Bradford in some of these things. The law which passed the General Court of our state last year, in regard to towns uniting and forming supervisory district, and hiring a superintendant for the same, is an important step in the right direction. State Superintendant Channing Folsom, at a Teachers Institute in Henniker spoke interestingly and plainly upon this subject; and hoped towns would take action upon it in town and school meetings this year. He is also ready to explain it to any one who will call upon him at his office in Concord. Education is the corner stone and firm foundation, of the world's progress. We all can agree upon that, therefore children should attend school regularly and be willing to conform to rules and regulations, beginning with Kindergarten through all other grades. Then there will be little to complain or find fault about upon either side. Mrs. Alice Rounsval of Newport is doing excellent work as a music teacher, and starting the pupils in the right direction to read music and giving foundation for a musical education to all who desire. She has very much needed some musical charts which we hope another year can be bought and placed in each room. Drawing has been introduced in the school this year and we feel confident the result will fully justify continuing the same. It is interesting also to know that patriotic instruction is taught in all our schools to some extent, and we wish our glorious flag might wave over all our school houses. Parents and friends should visit schools frequently and thus keep in touch with school work. The money has been carefully and judiciously expended

according to the needs of the schools and will return fourfold and abundant harvest to parents and pupils.

Special School District.

The following Report of Union School District is respectfully submitted. Miss Alice W. Goodwin has completed a year's work, with good success, in the grammar room. While criticisms are rife, it is also well to note all progress and success possible. Miss Blood opened the way for new normal methods, which were followed up by Miss Knowlton and Miss Goodwin. There is no reason why Bradford should not have first-class, up-to-date schools.

A serious detriment to our schools is the lack of co-operation between parents and teachers.

The third term of Primary school, taught by Miss Lizzie F. Peaslee, was finished with good success; the two following terms by Miss Annie M. Abbott. The attendance has been good, and the classes, mostly, have accomplished good work.

There are constantly coming before the committee little matters for solution, and questions for answers, which have been prayerfully and even tearfully studied, that a decision might be reached which our judgments felt was for the best interests of the schools. Although sharp criticisms have been brought to our notice, we doubt if those whose remarks have been the most caustic, would, under the circumstances, have suited themselves any better. It seems to us the town need have no hard or unkind feelings over our special district. All town pupils are admitted without paying tuition, and one fact, which seems to have been wholly overlooked, is that both school boards serve and work without any compensation, while the town committees receive pecuniary recognition.

We venture to say if Bradford had a high school and a kindergarten, a better course of studies might be adopted, and more uniform work accomplished. Teachers could then give more time to each pupil. There is much in supplementary work in which scholars gain much benefit. Chemistry in the course of study seems to be of little use, but geology might take its place. Astronomy would be very interesting, if only a few of the constellations were found.

If teachers instructed their pupils to invite their parents and friends to visit the schools oftener, it would create an interest and sympathy between them, and prove, we think, beneficial to each other, and uplifting to the school.

The music and drawing have enlarged their ideas and trained their eye and ear to beauty of sight and sound. The nature work, for which the grammar scholars have paid for from their own funds, has been a delight to all. Prof. James Johnson has set the boys and girls to thinking of things which come in their every-day life, and enlarge their line of thought.

Education stands on a supreme pinnacle of the world, and we watch with interest its grand stride onward and upward.

Report of Special School District.

The Committee were fortunate in procuring the services of experienced teachers for both schools. Miss Sadie Wells has had charge of the Grammar department the entire year. With untiring industry she has labored hard for the advancement of her pupils. Their recitations, especially in mathematics, show a great improvement, and that there has been hard study is evident. We are glad to note that writing and spelling have not been neglected, but have received the attention which their importance demands.

We regret that instruction in music has been discontinued. Few, except teachers, have an adequate knowledge of the good influence which music exerts in a school.

The Winter term closes with thirty-one pupils, of whom several are from other districts. Although there have been many absences from sickness, yet we think it has been a very profitable school-year, and teacher and scholars are deserving of commendation.

Mrs. Annie (Abbott) Danforth has been the teacher of the Primary department not only the present year, but also the two preceding terms. Under her instruction the pupils have made much progress. We noticed great improvement in writing, and that most of the copy-books are neatly kept. Reading and spelling have received proper attention. Mrs. Danforth has labored faithfully and patiently for the benefit of her school, and by so doing has gained the affection and good-will of her pupils.

The State of New Hampshire.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bradford in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Bradford on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.
3. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alteration and amendments of the constitution proposed by the constitutional convention shall be approved.
4. To see if the town will vote to do away with Pillsbury Highway law so called and return to former system of electing one or more Road agents.
5. To see if the town will vote to place an electric light on the Newport road near the residence of Wm. A. Carr.
Also one near the intersection of the Henniker and Hillsborough roads opposite the residence of Charles Gillis.
Also one near the residence of Josiah Melvin or J. H. Blaisdell.
Also one near the residence of Everett Kittredge.
One near George Perkins on new Sutton Road and raise money for same.
6. To see what action the town will take in relation to enlarging the stage in the Town Hall, and raise money for the same.
7. To see if the town will vote to repair the fence on north side of Pleasant Hill Cemetery and raise money for the same.
8. To see if the town will vote, or what action they will take in regard to dividing the school money between the school districts of the town.
9. To Transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Special School District.

Your Committee report that the schools of this District have made commendable progress the past year. An effort has been made to equalize the schools in order that the teachers might have more time to devote to the different classes. In a small way new text-books have been introduced, and each pupil has been supplied with books.

We hope that during the coming year there will be enough money raised to again commence the study of music.

The School Board, in presenting this report, have very few remarks to offer, but have embodied in tabular form such facts as they thought might be of interest.

We seem, in general, to have been fairly successful in securing the services of good teachers, who have labored diligently in imparting instruction to their pupils, and as a result, our schools, generally, have made progress in the right direction.

It is, however, to be regretted that, while most of our scholars have attended school regularly through the terms—some of them reaching perfection,—others have frequently been absent or tardy, some even falling far below a fair average attendance. Of course these latter cannot expect to receive the best results from the school. It is the plain duty of parents and guardians to enforce the attendance of their children at school. The pupils should strive to attend school every day, and give their attention to study while there. If they neglect to do so, they may be sorry when it is too late to make amends.

The number of children in town between 5 and 16 years old, as reported by the truant officer, was as follows :

Boys, 64. Girls, 51. Total, 115.

The number of pupils registered by our teachers is somewhat greater than that shown by the above figures, owing partly to the fact that several pupils from out of the district attend school here. The number registered is as follows :

Spring term, 125. Fall term, 128. Winter term, 115.
