## Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board :

Since my term of service has been short, I shall not attempt to make an exhaustive report.

In general, it seems evident that considerable care, thought and money have been used on various occasions to make your schools what they should be. It is equally apparent that this has occurred at intervals somewhat far apart and that in the interim there has been neglect of those multitudinous details that demand constant attention. This condition is not unusual nor is it strange. It is easier for communities most of whose time and thought are devoted to other lines of endeavor, to deal with schools periodically when their needs have become apparent to everybody and their improvement calls for enough of effort to make it seem eminently worth while.

Since, however, the district has voted to expend some of its school money in employing a superintendent, it seems reasonable for me to assume that the community is not content merely with conducting its schools in as good a manner as the average community of its size usually does, but that you desire to get full value for every unit of money or effort invested.

I would therefore urge upon you the desirability of a regular annual appropriation sufficient not only to guard against a temporary deterioration along any line but to insure a gradual improvement.

To keep the school plant always in condition: to keep ceilings, walls, floors, stove pipes, windows, outbuildings, in the same condition that the average housewife desires for her home or the merchant for his store, requires but little more money than the more spasmodic method.

The toilets in all the school buildings need improvement. At least one stool in each toilet should have a hinged second cover providing a large square hole for a boys urinal. The walls should be made tight. The youngest child should be able to fasten the door. At least at the Center, one of the largest schools and with most of

the children carrying their dinners, a separate toilet should be provided for each sex,

The old benches in four buildings should be replaced by modern comfortable seats as soon as practicable. In the meantime they should be set nearer together. At present the front of the seats are, on the average, five or six inches back of the back edge of the desks. Let any parent who wishes try the experiment of pulling his chair five inches back from the table and write and study in this position for two or three hours.

The seats at the Plain School should be turned around so that the children will face a blank wall instead of the two sunny south windows.

At the Village School the shed floor demands immediate repairs. The lighting in the rooms is very bad, especially on the blackboards. That this is causing a dangerous amount of eye strain there can be no doubt. I can think of no satisfactory improvement which does not involve radical changes in the building.

There is need of better blackboards in all the schools; of more maps, preferably without names; of a good dictionary in every school.

I find the district's supply of text-books much better than in many districts. There is need of more reading material. I recommend a change in Arithmetics and Language books when those in use are worn out. A few small dictionaries are needed for the individual use of pupils in the upper classes.

I recommend that the School Board ask for one hundred and fifty dollars for text-books and scholars' supplies and fifteen dollars for flags.

I have been asked why it is so difficult to secure teachers to fill vacancies occurring in Bradford. A study of teachers' salaries will give a partial answer to this question. The average monthly salary paid to women teachers throughout the state was \$41.93 in 1912, that paid in Bradford was \$31.00. Bradford's average salary has been increasing slowly in the last five years (though the salary in several schools has not been increased) but the rate of increase has not kept pace with the increase in the state as a whole. While the

average salary in Bradford has increased 10 5-7 per cent since 1898 the average throughout the state has increased 16 5-12 per cent. Vacancies in those schools where there has been no increase whatever are of course very difficult to fill.

I appreciate the cordial manner in which I have been met by the citizens, the pleasant relations with the teachers, and the support which the Board has accorded to me.

### **Report State Tax Commission 1914.**

#### **Increase in Public Expenditures.**

No power has constituted the members of the tax commission of guardians of the public in respect to expenditures for the support of government, and they have no disposition to assume that role. Nevertheless "economy being a most essential virtue in all states," and it being "the duty of legislators and magistrates \* \* \* to countenance and inculcate the principles of \* \* \* economy," all as set forth in the constitution of this state, the commissioners believe themselves to be amply justified in urging, as they have so often urged before, the importance of this subject upon the voters of the state. The public revenue, state and municipal, is the voters' business and they are responsible, directly or indirectly, for every extravagance affecting it from the inception to the termination of the fund.

Every compulsory contribution levied by public authority upon people or property is in the broad sense of the term a tax, nor is it made less obnoxious or burdensome if called a fee or a fine. In the figures that follow therefore, all fees, fines, and other exactions, if any, are included with the taxes upon polls and estates. To illustrate the comparative importance of the two classes, it may be said that the taxes upon polls and estates represent about 95 per cent. and all other income about 5 per cent. of the total revenue of the state, and of the counties, cities, towns, districts and precincts therein.

Taxes as defined above have increased by leaps and bounds in recent years. In 1903 the sum of all the taxes assessed by and within the state of New Hampshire was \$5,373,420.22; in 1913 it was \$8,765,039.07, an increase of \$3,391,618.85, or 63 per cent., in ten years. But these figures do not adequately represent the velocity the upward movement has now attained. To show that it is necessary to divide the ten-year period: The levy in 1908 was \$924,388.79, or 17 per cent. greater than in 1903, while that in 1913 was \$2,467,230.06, or 39 per cent. greater than in 1908. By so much did the advance in the last half of said period exceed that in the first half. These figures will be the more alarming if it is remembered that while taxes already sufficiently heavy were advancing 63 per cent., the population of the state increased only about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  per cent., and while the one was advancing 39 per cent., the other increased only about  $2\frac{1}{4}$  per cent.

It is instructive to study the subject from another angle. In the ten years from 1904 to 1914, both inclusive, the annual increase in all taxes defined and limited as above was as follows:

The average yearly increase for the whole period was \$336,561.85. The upward trend is more plainly shown, however, by dividing, as before, the ten-year period in the middle and considering the halves separately. For the first five years the average annual increase was \$184,877.76; for the last five years it was \$493,446.01. It is surely pertinent to consider how long the little state of New Hampshire, almost stationary in wealth, can sustain a tax already



burdensome and increasing at the rate of practically half a million dollars a year without crippling her industries and impoverishing her people. Plainly it is a condition not calculated to attract capital from without the state or to encourage business within the same.

From the per capita standpoint the situation is not less disturbing. In 1903 there were assessed \$12.88 in taxes for each man, woman and child in the state. Five years later there were assessed \$14.75 for each individual, and in five years more \$20.09. If in 1913 taxes had been equally distributed among all the people it would have meant a burden of \$100 for each family of five members. Though in reality there was little such equality in the assessment there was much in the payment. The fact is that those who occupy, use or consume property, no matter who owns it, are those who in the last analysis pay most, if not all, of the taxes thereon. If the wage earner or the man of limited means understood he was in reality paying something like \$100 a year in state and municipal and half as much more in federal taxes for the government of himself, his wife and three children his influence and his vote would more frequently make for economy in appropriations and expenditures than heretofore.

No statistics for the year 1914 appear for the reason that they are not yet at hand except in part.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00 to be used towards the purchase of a town clock.
7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board:

After a year and a half of personal acquaintance with the schools of Bradford; after a study comparing Bradford School District with its neighbors and with its own past; after tabulating the latest attendance statistics; I find much that is discouraging, a little that is encouraging.

The general situation is not only bad, it is growing worse; in some instances actually worse, in others comparatively so. That is: progress, where it has occurred, has been very small as compared with the average of the districts in the state and thus Bradford is falling farther and farther behind.

In 1908 the average monthly wage paid to Bradford teachers was \$8.01 below the state average; in 1913 it was \$11.18 below. The tax rate for schools has averaged, in eight years prior to 1914, 65 cents on \$1000 less than the average in the state and in 1914 it was the lowest it has been since 1908. In 1912, of the 255 school districts in the state, only 43 had a lower tax rate for schools than Bradford; in 1913, only 33 had a lower rate. Of the nine towns in the immediate neighborhood (See Table of "Comparative Statistics for 1913") only Newbury and Washington were paying lower wages to teachers in 1913.

If the interest of the tax-payers in the schools may be judged, in a general way, by the tax rate, the interest of parents may likewise be judged, to a certain extent, by the attendance table.

The parent who is thoroughly convinced of the value of the school to his child will see that the child attends every day unless prevented by sickness or some most important reason; his child will appear in the morning ON TIME; he will not ask to have his child dismissed an hour or a half-hour before the other children in his class except for most urgent reasons. A comparison of the attendance table in last year's report with the one in this year's report discloses

the following tendencies backward: The per cent of attendance for 1912-13 was 90.09; for 1913-14, 89.40; a very small change, but, such as it is, a slipping backward. In the former year there were 183 cases of tardiness; in the latter, 296. In the former year, 23 cases of dismissal; in the latter 168 cases. The table for last fall term shows no instance of improvement over the fall of a year ago except that the number of dismissals has decreased and the number of visits to the schools has increased.

This increase in the number of visitors is a hopeful sign. I regret that so large a per cent of them come, not to see the schools at their regular daily work, but to see some special exercises, which have only a remote connection with the regular program. These visitors, nevertheless, have an opportunity to see the building in which the regular work goes on, and where their children are housed for thirty hours of every school week. I hope that there may have been a few who have carefully inspected the buildings, front and rear, ceilings and floors, blackboards and walls. Perchance one or two have taken pains to estimate the probable cost of the building to a former generation that built it and to compare this with the cost of the repairs that the present generation has made. However much we of today may disagree as to the value of that "Little Old Red Schoolhouse" we cannot disagree as to its cost. It stood for sacrifice—the sacrifice of a community for the education of its youth. No schoolbuilding in Bradford hints of any recent real sacrifice.

During the past year the village schoolrooms have been improved with paint and whitewash and the shed floor has been repaired.

Some new stovepipe has been put in at the Center School. In other respects the situation is the same as mentioned a year ago in my report except that the superintendent, assisted by the teacher and pupils, ripped up the seats at the Plain School and faced them toward the one wall which is unbroken by windows.

A considerable amount of new reading material has been purchased. New geographies and language books have been introduced in all the schools. A few new arithmetics and physiologies have been bought. Each teacher has been supplied with a fairly good dictionary and each of the pupils in the upper grades has a small dictionary

for individual use. I recommend the same appropriation for textbooks and supplies as last year: one hundred and fifty dollars.

Five new flags, with poles and all necessary fixtures, were bought last year. The coming year will not require an appropriation for this purpose.

The covered earthen water jar at the Center, the door mats at the Village and the improved wastebaskets at both these schools are only a few of the many little things that might help to make all the schools more sanitary or more comfortable.

I believe that the teachers are all doing their best for the success of their schools. In nearly every instance the teachers are the best we have had since my coming into office. Their efforts, often under discouraging conditions of attendance and sanitation, are commendable. In the majority of the schools the small number of children makes the work monotonous for both the teacher and pupil.

The tax-payer, too, is the loser because of the large number of little schools. While Bradford's tax rate for schools is one of the lowest, the cost PER PUPIL is one of the highest in the state. In 1912 only 40 districts paid more per pupil than Bradford; in 1913 only 35.

You have somewhat simplified the finances of the district during the past year by abandoning the custom of giving an order book to each member of the Board, and by paying bills only at Board meetings. Another change in the line of better business methods would be to make the place of meeting the place for filing all receipts and other papers belonging to the district.

If the orders signed by the Board were forwarded immediately to the District Treasurer for payment, instead of being given to the payee, no allowance would need to be made for "Outstanding Orders" in estimating the financial condition of the district.

In view of the fact that the schools are now closed for lack of funds, which must be a disappointment to some, at least, of the parents, I would recommend that every effort be made to place the exact financial situation before the people, that all outstanding bills be listed, that a careful estimate be made of the probable cost of main-

taining the schools with the best teachers you feel that you can afford, for as many weeks as seems reasonable; that the cost of remodeling the Village schoolhouse be definitely determined; and that on all these matters the School Board make a definite recommendation to the voters at the coming district meeting.

Gentlemen, I have attempted to report to you and, through you to the citizens of Bradford, the situation as I see it. I am not unfamiliar with country schools similar to those in Bradford. My attitude in calling to your attention some discouraging features is not unsympathetic nor is it pessimistic. There must be among your citizens a goodly number who are anxious that the schools should be such centers of inspiration and uplift as good schools can become; who are willing to pay for such schools, to the point of sacrifice if necessary, in thought, in time, in moral support, in money. It is to that type of citizen that this report is addressed; it is for him that I have attempted to present my honest opinion.

I know of no easy method of securing good schools. They are the result of effort, ceaseless effort on the part of teachers, officials, the community. But our children, like ourselves, can "Pass this way but once." We would not give them less than our best.
